News and Reminders from Administration to Students and Parents:

- Per the student parent handbook and the school board, **appropriate dress and grooming** must be maintained. Shorts and skirt lengths should hang lower than your fingertips when arms are resting at your sides. Strapless tops should not be worn. Spaghetti straps should be one inch minimum.
