We have a few reminders for our families:

- ★ The school day starts at **8:30am** and goes until **3:12pm** at the high school and starts at **8:35am** and goes until **3:10pm** at the elementary school. It is important to make sure your child(ren) are at school on time.
- ★ Breakfast is served at both schools from **8:05am** until **8:30am**. Please do not send your children to school earlier than 8:05am.
- ★ Lunch is served at the Elementary School from **11:10am** to **11:55am** for the Elementary students (**11:10am** to **11:35am** for grades pre-K-2 and **11:30am** to **11:55am** for grades 3-6) and **12:03pm** to **12:33pm** for the High School students.
- ★ If you would like to have lunch or breakfast with your child, please call ahead to let the kitchen staff know. Please note the lunch time changes listed above.
- ★ All parents and visitors must report to the office when they come to the school, whether it's to eat lunch with your child, drop off a forgotten item or pick your child up early. **You will not be admitted into the schools without a name tag.**
- ★ **You will not be able to meet with any teachers during the course of the school day.** You may, however, set up an appointment to meet with them outside of school hours. Any non-emergent phone calls to teachers will put through to their voicemail. They will return your call when they have a free moment.

### **REQUIRED COURSES:**

SEVENTH: English, Math, Science, Physical Education/Health, Music, Ag Ed, Social Studies, Keyboarding, STEM, and Life Skills

## **NORTH DAKOTA GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS (NDCC 15.1-21-02.2) (22 units of credits required)**

1. Four units of English language arts from a sequence that includes literature, composition, and speech;
2. Three units of mathematics, which may include one unit of computer science approved by the superintendent of public instruction;
3. Three units of science, consisting of:
  - a. One unit of biology, one unit of chemistry, and one unit of physics **or**
  - b. One unit of biology, one unit of physical science, and one unit or two one-half units of any other science;
4. Three units of social studies, including:
  - a. One unit of United States history;
  - b. One-half unit of United States government and one-half unit of economics **or** one unit of problems of democracy; and
  - c. One unit or two one-half units of any other social studies, which may include civics, civilization, geography and history, multicultural studies, North Dakota studies, psychology, sociology, and world history;
5. One unit of physical education **or** one-half unit of physical education and one-half unit of health;
6. Three units of:
  - a. Foreign languages;
  - b. Native American languages;
  - c. Fine arts; **or**
  - d. Career and technical education courses; and
7. Any five additional units.
